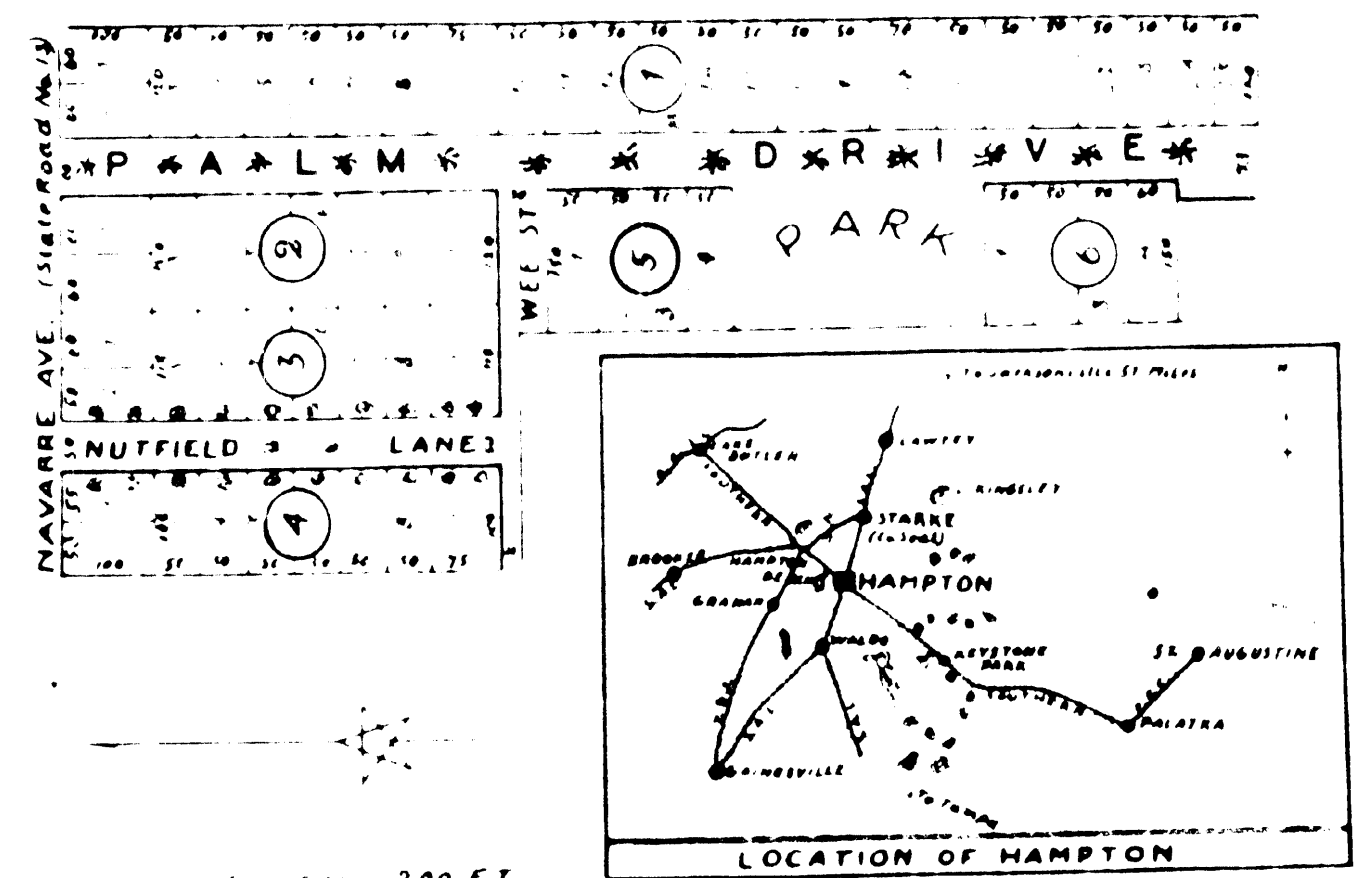


GOULD PARK DEVELOPMENT

This reasonably restricted subdivision is in the city of HAMPTON, 3 minutes' walk from P.O. and shopping center and fronts on main Dixie. High and dry (18 ft. above sea level), electric lights, city water (good drinking) and telephones. The city has 3 churches, good hotel, chamber of commerce, 8 mails daily. Two railroads - Seaboard and Seaboard; 16 trains stop. Buses to Jacksonville and Gainesville and local ice delivery. Only 15 miles west is sandy shores of beautiful Little Santa Fe lake, with excellent bathing, fishing, boating and high class dance hall.
